DSDT's plan includes \$3,928 to be paid through COVID-19 Emergency Assistance Grants.

These grants are designed to provide emergency financial aid grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus.

Grants may be awarded to students who meet all of the following criteria:

- Currently enrolled as a diploma seeking student at DSDT;
- Eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965;
- Have documented financial need or hardship due to coronavirus (e.g., substantial expenditures or loss of income, low expected family contribution, inability to pay for expenses included in the cost of attendance, etc.); and
- Have made reasonable use of other sources of support.

The Emergency Assistance Grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis and are not renewable. Award amounts will be determined based on your eligibility and circumstances but will not exceed \$785.60 per application.
